At Southway Primary School, we are committed to using the PE and Sport Premium to make sustainable improvements to the quality of physical education and sport. For the 2025–2026 academic year, our focus is on enhancing unstructured times, investing in playground and PE equipment, training staff and sports leaders, strengthening our partnership with the School Sports Partnership (SSP), and expanding access to after-school clubs. Our goal is to ensure that every child has the opportunity to engage in high-quality physical activity that supports their physical, emotional, and social development.

Key Indicators Addressed

We measure our success against the Department for Education's five key indicators:

- 1. Engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
- 2. Raising the profile of PE and sport across the school.
- 3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of staff.
- 4. Broader experience of sports and activities.
- 5. Increased participation in competitive sport.

Swimming Attainment

Meeting national curriculum requirements for swimming and water safety

Overview: 60 children from Year 6 have been taking part in the Swim Ed program.

Initial Assessment

- 57% of children were able to swim at least 25m.
- 40% of children were able to use a range of strokes effectively.
- 25% of children were able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Final Assessment

- 75% of children were able to swim at least 25m.
- 77% of children were able to use a range of strokes effectively.
- 97% of children were able to perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Schools can choose to use the Primary PE and Sport Premium to provide additional provision for swimming, but this must be for activity above and above the national curriculum requirements.
